## "Arthurian Place Names of Wales" Meet a pro on this subject in St. Paul Nov. 21

Scott Lloyd works at the Royal Commission on the Ancient and Historical Monuments of Wales at the National Library of Wales in Aberystwyth. He has served on the committee of the British Branch of the International Arthurian Society. In his recent book, The Arthurian Place Names of Wales, he traces back more than a 150 sites in Wales dating from the 9th century. It is a comprehensive look at the extensive evidence of the Arthurian legacy in Wales and Welsh culture. He lives near Aberystwyth in mid-Wales.

Scott Lloyd has devoted decades of research to the subject of Arthur and Ancient Britain. He and Steve Blake are co-founders of the Centre for Arthurian Studies at the North East Wales Institute, affiliate of the University of Wales, and enjoy strong links with the 'Camelot' research project at the University of Rochester in New York. They also advise and promote the world's leading Arthurian Collection housed in Flintshire Library HQ, and have worked with the Welsh Academic Press on a leading series of Welsh Arthurian source material.

Scott attended the University of Wales in Aberystwyth and the book formed the basis for his Master Philosophy thesis in 2009. The book was published in 2017 by the University of Wales Press.

#### Details on Scott Lloyd's presentation:

WHERE: St. Anthony Park Lutheran Church, 2323 Como Ave. W., St. Paul about one mile east of Hwy. 280. Street parking and lot at condo complex, Zvago, across Luther Place from the side of church.

WHEN: Thurs., Nov. 21, 6 p.m.
