Diners can choose vegetarian filling or meat/vegetable filling on the enclosed yellow reservation form.



## Tecwyn Vaughan Jones from Bangor University will lead NAFOW seminars AND visit our Society March 20


Tecwyn Vaughan Jones hails from the slate quarrying town of Blaenau Ffestiniog located in the heart of the Snowdonia mountain range. Both his grandparents and father were involved in the slate mining industry.

He was educated at Ysgol y Moelwyn High School in that town and from there went to study at the University of Wales, Bangor. He graduated in Sociology and later proceeded to complete an MA in Folklore. He worked as a research officer at the National Museum of Wales and was based at St. Fagans. That site is now called the National History Museum. It is located on the outskirts of Cardiff.

Following this, he was Marketing Manager for the National Museum of Wales before leaving Wales for Canada to study and teach in the Department of Folklore at the Memorial University of Newfoundland in St. Johns. He returned to Cardiff in 1993 and taught the MA in Folklore graduate programme in the School of Welsh, Cardiff University.

In 1997 he was appointed Director of the Celtica Heritage Centre in Machynlleth and in 2000 was appointed to his current post as Resident Director of the Central College Iowa Study Abroad Programme at Bangor University. Since his appointment, over 1,000 American students have completed the programme.

His teaching interests are Identity Studies, Globalization and Ethnic Cultures, Contemporary Wales and Folklore. He specializes in the folklore of children and folk custom. He returned to live in Blaenau Ffestiniog eight years ago and is very glad to have had the opportunity to return to the town after an absence of so many years.



Tecwyn Vaughan Jones will speak here the evening of Thursday, March 20. His topic will be "Welsh and Celtic?" He will also present two seminars at NAFOW 2014 in Minneapolis Labor Day August 29 and 30.

## **Life Memberships**

# Why do we offer Life Memberships, and why should you want one?

The St. David's Society of Minnesota decided to offer life memberships as an option a few years back. The rate for the life memberships was set at \$175.00, or about ten years of individual membership renewals.

The decision was made to set up a reserve fund with the receipts from the life memberships. We invest this fund. The idea is to stretch out the money in the fund for use over many years.

As a life member, you will receive the newsletter and be a member of the St. David's Society for as long as we have a valid address to send your mailings to.

#### Advantages to the society.

We have a fund that is expected to provide a reserve and also annual income for the life of the St. David's Society.

Having reserves gives us the potential of more "clout" with outside sources if we have the need to handle a special project, such as obtaining a proper venue for a Welsh choir or chorus to perform in Minnesota.

Having the "perpetual" income gives us a base income that assures that the work we do in support of Welsh education will continue for many years to come.

#### Advantages to the members.

For everyone, life memberships prevent those embarrassing renewal notices in the mail. They also help prevent a lapse of membership due to inattention to renewal dates and notices. This happens more often than you might think.

For younger members, life memberships give individual members the ability to save money over someone who chooses to renew membership every year for over ten years.

For older members, life memberships give individual members the ability to make a gift to the society as an ongoing source of income for that time in the future when the member is no longer able to contribute.

#### The rules for a life membership are simple.

A life membership is for one person. It is not for a couple, and it is not for a legal entity such as a corporation. Your living trust can own a life membership, but it cannot be passed on.

#### Two notes.

Some people with current family memberships have chosen to take out two life memberships. Others who now own a life membership also provide gift memberships every year to a spouse, partner, offspring or other loved ones. This is not a requirement. It is a definite benefit to your St. David's Society and a thoughtful thing to do for others.

If our mailings to you start being sent back by the post office, we will attempt to locate you. Until we find out where you are, you will not receive your newsletter and may be dropped from the active membership list.

### **News of the Well-Read Dragons**

Turf or Stone by Margiad Evans, Library of Wales Press

This book, our title for December, reminds one of the reason for book clubs. This writer started the meeting announcing that she had found no character of redeeming social

value whatsoever in the book. Others were not offended nor surprised by that reaction, but they were able to "fill in the blanks," to help me see the lessons to be learned by attention to every character.

The main character could be Mary Bicknor, the companion of a wealthy old woman, who is forced into marriage to the brutish Easter Probert. Or, the main character may be Probert himself. Or Phoebe, the daughter of the estate owners. Who knows? The group discussed several possibilities and, as always, opinions were as varied as people present. Another reason to be part of a book club when reading any volume.

Author Margiad Evans was born Peggy Eileen Whistler in London in 1909. She visited Benhall Farm, the home of her aunt and uncle in 1918, and promptly fell in love with the Welsh Marches. In 1920, her family moved nearer to that area and her understanding of Border life developed, including her use of the pseudonym by which she is known today.

The book for Feb. 1 is *Testimonies* by Patrick O'Brian (note spelling of author's name). An English scholar moves to a small cottage in a North Wales valley. It's across the road from Gelli, the farm of Emyr and Bronwen Vaughan and their bratty son Gerallt. Nain and Taid [Grandmother and Grandfather] also live there. They endured many tough years on the farm and now want everything good for Emyr.


The unfolding of actions and emotions between the reserved, inexperienced academic and the earthy farm people is not unpredictable, but is without the cruelty seen in our December title.

## **IN MEMORIAM: Ralph Crews**

Ralph Wilson Crews, Lt. Col. USAF, Retired, of Golden Valley, died December 28, 2013, at the age of 95. He was born on May 28, 1918, to Walter and Mabel Crews in Saxe, Virginia. He attended the two-room Saxe School, Drakes Branch High School and graduated from Virginia Polytechnic Institute, now known as Virginia Tech, in 1942 with a degree in civil engineering.

He was commissioned as a 2nd Lieutenant in the U.S. Air Corps and immediately left for Europe on the Queen Mary and served in WWII in England, France and Germany. When he returned in 1946, he was assigned to Lowry Field in Denver, Colo., where he met his wife, Betty Joanne Anderson.

He had assignments in Texas, New Mexico, Illinois, Ohio, California, and Wyoming. He attended Ballistic Missile School at Ft. Bliss and received a master's degree in Research Management from the University of Chicago in 1953.

After serving 22 years in the Air Force, he retired as Lieutenant Colonel and his last assignment was on the construction of 150 Minuteman Missile sites. These missiles were a major deterrent to war with the Soviets. When a dignitary once questioned whether we would ever get our money's worth out of the massive nuclear weapons, he could only reply, "You better hope not."

He worked 14 years for the Federal Aviation Agency. He was a long time member of Spirit of Hope United Methodist Church, the Golden Valley Historical Society, St. David's Society, American Legion and enjoyed reading, maps, and collecting stamps.

He is survived by his wife of 66 years, Betty Joanne, of Golden Valley; and his five children: Richard Crews of Encinitas, Calif.; Mandy Heard (Don), of Eau Claire, Wis.; Betsy Carnahan (James) of Edina, Minn.; Stephen Crews, of Jacksonville, Fla.; and Kenneth Crews (Elizabeth) of Los Angeles, Calif. He is also survived by nine grandchildren.

Memorials can be made to Spirit of Hope United Methodist Church in Golden Valley, Minn., or to the Golden Valley Historical Society.

Interment was December 31, 2013, at Glen Haven Memorial Gardens, with a memorial service the same day at Spirit of Hope United Methodist Church.
