With the recent resignation of our long-term Archivist, Mae Howells Anderson, it is now time for the Society to find a permanent and publically accessible location for our boxes of archival material.

This October, Judith Evans Warner and Kay Gavin met with Ashley Edwards at the Minnesota Historical Society in the Minnesota History Center in Saint Paul. During their meeting, Judith and Kay learned that two volumes of the Society's minutes had been donated in 1985.

Knowing that everything we wanted to donate would be accessible to the public, the Board decided to move forward with the transfer of our archival material. Before the donation takes place, several members of the Society will review and catalogue each item.

Soon after the transfer is made, Society members as well as members of the public, will be able to go on-line to review the complete catalogue of donated items. We will add links to the MHS site on our website.

Plans are being made to hold one of the Society meetings at the Minnesota History Center where a staff member will conduct a tour and provide us with information on how to access the Society documents as well as other documents in their vast collection. We are aiming for January 2014 for the transfer to take place. Watch the newsletter for updates!




