St. David's Annual Banquet is coming up

We host this year's celebration of St. David's Day on Saturday, February 29, 2020, 11:30 a.m. -2:30 p.m. at the Double Tree by Hilton (new name, same place as last year), 2540 N. Cleveland Ave., Roseville. To reserve your seat and lunch order, please complete the yellow registration form, included with this newsletter, by February 21.

The afternoon program will feature excerpts from *Blodwen*, the first-ever Welsh opera, composed by Dr. Joseph Parry in 1878, using a libretto by Welsh folk poet Richard Davies. Following the pattern of romantic-Italian opera, the story takes place in 14th century Wales and includes a wedding, lovers, dying heroes and a dramatic final twist.

Blodwen received its U.S. premiere only last year in Billings, Montana, in a performance using an adaptation by Dulais Rhys.

Our program will include several songs from the opera, sung by local professional singers KrisAnne Weiss and Wesley Frye, as well as a chorus of local singers performing the finale from Act III. The music includes "Men of Harlech" and the famous "Hywel a Blodwen" love duet. While we cannot present the full opera, we'll share a synopsis of the opera so you won't miss the big picture.

Join us for our next meeting, whether or not you've read the book.




