Society Board member Taff Roberts and cinematographer Blake Darst recently returned from Wales, where they began filming for a **new documentary** Taff is producing and directing



After three years of planning and several false starts due to COVID and unexpected travels back home, **Out of the Mist Celtic Theatre** and the **St. David's Society of Minnesota** are pleased to present "An Evening with John Dingley" at the Celtic Junction Arts Center. John Dingley, arguably our most noted local Welshman, is an actor, singer, poet, stone mason, master glass engraver, published author, and renowned storyteller. He came to our shores from his native Wales in 1975, and promptly spent seven years studying animal science, statistics, entymology, nutrition and ethology at the University of Minnesota. He was a longtime member of The *Na Fianna* Irish Theatre Company, which performed for many years not only in the Twin Cities, but all over the Midwest including Milwaukee, Chicago, and Winnipeg. John was also the owner and proprietor of The Irish Well in St. Paul, a pub and restaurant that hosted numerous Irish musicians in the mid-nineties.

John will sing songs, recite poems, and tell stories old and new! He will also speak about activities close to his heart, such as vertical farming and The Raptor Research Project, of which he is president. We have heard rumored that there maybe a few slides and a Welsh harpist! John will also be selling and signing copies of his latest book, A Visit Home - a collection of short stories and a few poems - at the end of the evening. This event is open to the public, and tickets - \$20 per person (\$15 for students and seniors over 60) - can be purchased at the door or online at https://celticjunction.org/. #### **UPDATE FROM THE BOARD - ANNUAL REPORT** Submitted by President, Janice Barbee

#### Members Enjoyed Seeing Each Other in Person at Annual Meeting and Picnic

The 2022 Annual Meeting and Picnic was held on Sunday, August 14, from 4 – 6 pm in a pavilion at Wabun Picnic Area in Minnehaha Regional Park in Minneapolis. Several people brought treats and the Society provided snacks and water.

The president of the Society, Janice Barbee, presented a list of the activities the Society has offered since the 2021 picnic:

- The **Well-Read Dragon's Book Group** met six times on-line to discuss some of the wealth of books by Welsh authors.
- An "Idea Committee" was formed at the 2021 picnic with members David Richards, Gail Manning, David Evan Thomas, Jean Greenwood, Hywel Roberts, and Janice Barbee. The committee's purpose is to look at ways to attract younger people to become members and find ways to partner with organizations in Wales. Because of the difficulties caused by the pandemic, the group decided to put this on hold for the time being.
- Our annual **Holiday Tea** was held on Zoom on December 11. Members told stories of memorable holidays at home and in Wales.
- On January 22, our board member Hywel Roberts invited Twm Elias, a naturalist, academic, storyteller, historian, to speak to us from Wales on the Mabinogion via Zoom. He told us about one of the stories, *The Story of Lleu and Blodeuwedd*, and connected the story to places and place names in Wales with slides and photos of Wales. His presentation was a hit and received calls for an encore.
- Our **St. David's Day Celebration** was held on February 26 on-line for the second year. **Dai Harris** joined us from Wales and sang us a *plygain* carol and gave us background on the tradition. We also showed a delightful video of children celebrating the day in St. David, Wales. We gathered in breakout sessions on Zoom and shared stories of our travels to Wales.
- We thanked Hywel for finding our second guest from Wales in our Welsh Speaker Series. **Owen Roberts** from the **National Library of Wales** presented a fascinating talk via Zoom about the library and its collections on March 20. - On June 28, we were delighted to welcome two Welsh actors and thrilled to gather for an inperson performance of the play, West. Gareth John Bale and Gwenllian Higginson performed at the St. Anthony Park Lutheran Church which our member Mary Mergenthal arranged for the Society.

The 18 Society members present at the meeting approved the ballot of Board members: **Ron Adams, Janice Barbee, Ryan Evans, Hywel Roberts, Pam Rose, and two new board members, Shannon King and David Richards**. They replace two out-going members, **Bob and Barbara Sherman**. We thanked the Sherman's for their many years of service to the Society.

A healthy end-of-year Financial Report for the Society was provided by our treasurer, **Pam Rose**, and the report for the Foundation was given by **Ron Adams**.

We then heard from each person present about something memorable they wanted to share about their past year and then we enjoyed free-flowing conversation. The event ended with some people playing bocce ball or "boules".

Many people expressed how great it was to get together again!

#### Dan Proud Releases a CD of His Music

From 2021-2022, long-Standing St. David's Society of Minnesota member and Past President Dan Proud (1992-1993 and 1998-1999) completed and recorded nine original songs. He was thrilled that Vets on Frets – a local band of which he is a member – recorded the music with him. His CD was released at a concert held in Madison, Wisconsin on October 2 where he performed the music live. Vets on Frets, a local musician Lisa Johnson, Dan's sister Kit, and his friend Nancy Wunderlin accompanied him.

A short piece published online by WORT (89.9 FM) reports that Vets on Frets is a band formed from the non-profit Guitars for Vets, which shares the healing power of music by providing free guitar lessons to veterans. Vets on Frets performs a variety of music, from 60s and 70s rock to folk, country and western. Dan, an instructor for Guitars for Vets, has been playing and writing music since the 1960s.

## Welsh Medievalist Joins Macalester College English Department! Submitted By Mary Morris Mergenthal

(Ed. Note - Information from NYU and Macalester College has been added)

Assistant Professor Coral Lumbley, having completed her Postdoctoral Faculty Fellowship at New York University, has joined Macalester's Faculty. Having earned a BA and MA in English at the University of Texas, San Antonio and her doctorate in English and medieval studies from the University of Illinois, Urbana-Champaign, Dr. Lumley specializes in the history of English literature, the history of Celtic language and literature, and how rhetorics of power intersect in the British Isles.

Among her many other awards and honors, Dr. Lumbley was awarded the 2019 American Dissertation Fellowship by the American Association of University Women and the 2018 Lloyd Family Travel Scholarship by the North American Wales Foundation. Her published works include "Venerable Relics of Ancient Lore:' Medieval Welsh Literature as Postcolonial World Literature" (JOURNAL OF WORLD LITERATURE 5.3 (2020), 372-92) and "The 'Dark Welsh': Color, Race, and Alterity in the Matter of Medieval Wales" (Included in Critical Race and The Middle Ages, ed. Dorothy Kim. Literature Compass 16.9-10 (2019)).

Dr. Lumbley is presently working on a book titled *Racialization and Resistance in Medieval England and Wales: Ecological Imperialism and England's First Colony*, examining how England used literary methods to justify its colonization of Wales and how Welsh writers crafted an anti-English rhetoric of their own in response. Her course offerings for the 2022-2023 academic year range from "The Language and Literature of Medieval Wales" and "Major British Writers: The Self and Society" to "Reading Along the Silk Road".

She has expressed her eagerness to meet members of the Society, and our fingers are crossed that she will agree to speak at a future event. The article introducing her to the Macalester Community notes that in her Language and Literature of Medieval Wales course, students are invited to discover how and why J.R.R. Tolkien used medieval Welsh as the basis for his invented languages. Lucky Macalester and lucky us!

From the Welsh North American Association: This North American tradition began in 1929 when over 4,000 people gathered at Niagara Falls for the first National Gymanfa Ganu. It became the largest gathering of the Welsh, descendants, and friends in North America. The festival is held in a different location each year, in either



the U.S. or Canada, on the shared Labor Day holiday weekend. This year is its 90th anniversary. Prepare yourself for four full days of song, merriment, and camaraderie with old and new friends, celebrating the life, heritage, and culture of Wales. The **2023 North American Festival of Wales**, funded in part by the Women's Welsh Clubs of America, will take place from **August 31 - September 3, 2023** in **Lincoln, Nebraska**. While you can reserve your accommodations now, reservations for Festival tickets will open March 2023. More information will be shared in our next newsletter.
